Since strawberry season is fast approaching I thought I'd share one of my favorite recipes using that wonderful fruit.

#### Spinach Salad with Strawberries;

#### Ingredients:

1/2 of a 283 gm box of baby spinach, 2 small English cucumbers, sliced, a handful of sesame, sunflower, or pumpkin seeds, 2 green onions sliced, 1/2 of a 454 gm box of strawberries sliced, a handful of Chow Mien noodles (added just before serving).

#### **Dressing**:

1/2 cup of vegetable oil, 1/4 cup white balsamic vinegar, 1-2 tbsp soy sauce, 2-4 tbsp of honey, 2 garlic cloves crushed.

Blend all together. Add to salad. Toss to coat well. Add Chow Mien noodles and serve.

#### A Note From Membership


I hope this note finds all of our members well and busy with all of the projects that have gone unfinished due to lack of time.
